- 1) Contact information
- 2) Lay summary (not to exceed 1 page)
- 3) Research proposal (not to exceed 4 pages)
 - a. Abstract
 - b. Hypothesis and Specific aims
 - c. Background and rationale
 - d. Approach/methods
 - e. Expected results/challenges
 - f. Significance
 - g. Extent of collaboration with other investigators
- 4) Bibliography (no limit)
- 5) Budget and Budget Justification (The B+ Foundation does not cover Indirect Expenses)
- 6) Institutional Resources – address relevant access to laboratory, clinical, animal, computer, office resources, need to complete your research, if applicable (no more than one page)
- 7) Biosketch in NIH format (no more than 4 pages)
- 8) Other grant support (current, pending, and past 3 years)

AWARD GUIDELINES

- All research must be directly related to pediatric cancer.
- All completed grant applications will be reviewed by a panel of medical experts.
- Research proposals will be evaluated based upon:
 - Quality of science
 - Innovation
 - Potential for success
 - Potential impact on field
 - Quality of applicant
 - Quality of institutional environment
 - Appropriateness of budget
 - Collaboration
- Selected grant recipients give The B+ Foundation permission to use Applicant's logo, images, photos, and posting of research proposal title and results as the charity sees fit.
- Submission of the application does not entitle Applicant to an award. The B+ Foundation reserves the right to select grant recipients at its sole discretion.
